All the above should be developed and described in such a language which is for audience of almost same caliber who may appreciate the subject, its chapter-wise build up in totality including tools, techniques, apparatus etc work seemingly most befitting to the solution of the problem stated in the hypothesis. This is evident (Y/N): ()

C. Chapter 2 The Literature Survey: This chapter should be fully decomposed to arrive at an elaborate "STATEMENT OF THE PROBLEM". leaving no stone unturned in respect of relevant books, websites/links, Journals, proceedings of the related Conferences/ Seminars/Workshops throughout the globe.

It is to be noted that Ph.D. is not granted for titbit solutions of many diverse problems. It is awarded in fact to recognise the talent of the scholar to arrive at a single wholesome problem whose solution may prove to provide a quantum jump in innovation for solving in general some real life problem or academic problem agreed by many, i.e., by the related research community as a whole. For this one may refer to nationally, globally acknowledged RESEARCH PROBLEMS stated in latest review articles and editorials published by eminent experts in esteemed journals, websites, Govt. Reports, reports of forums of Industry, business, trade etc. Even in a country like ours, Annual Reports of various Ministries both of State and Central governments publish "Thrust Areas of Research", where they have provision for funding the aspiring expert researchers whether in Govt or private institutes of higher education and research. This is available both in hard copy of their Annual Reports and soft copy on their websites. (Excerpt from Meity may be seen in Annexure I.)

It is the responsibility of the Ph.D. scholars to carve out his/her "Problem.



Statement" which is unique and desirable by him/her self within the existing constraints and duly endorsed by his/her Ph.D. supervisor.

It is once again emphasized that when a Ph.D. Scholar is writing his/her this chapter for the review of the work done so far, it should be in his/her own wording free from any syntactical, semantic errors/confusions and plagiarism. A write up on plagiarism Detection and avoidance in research papers/Ph.D. thesis is given in Annexure II
