

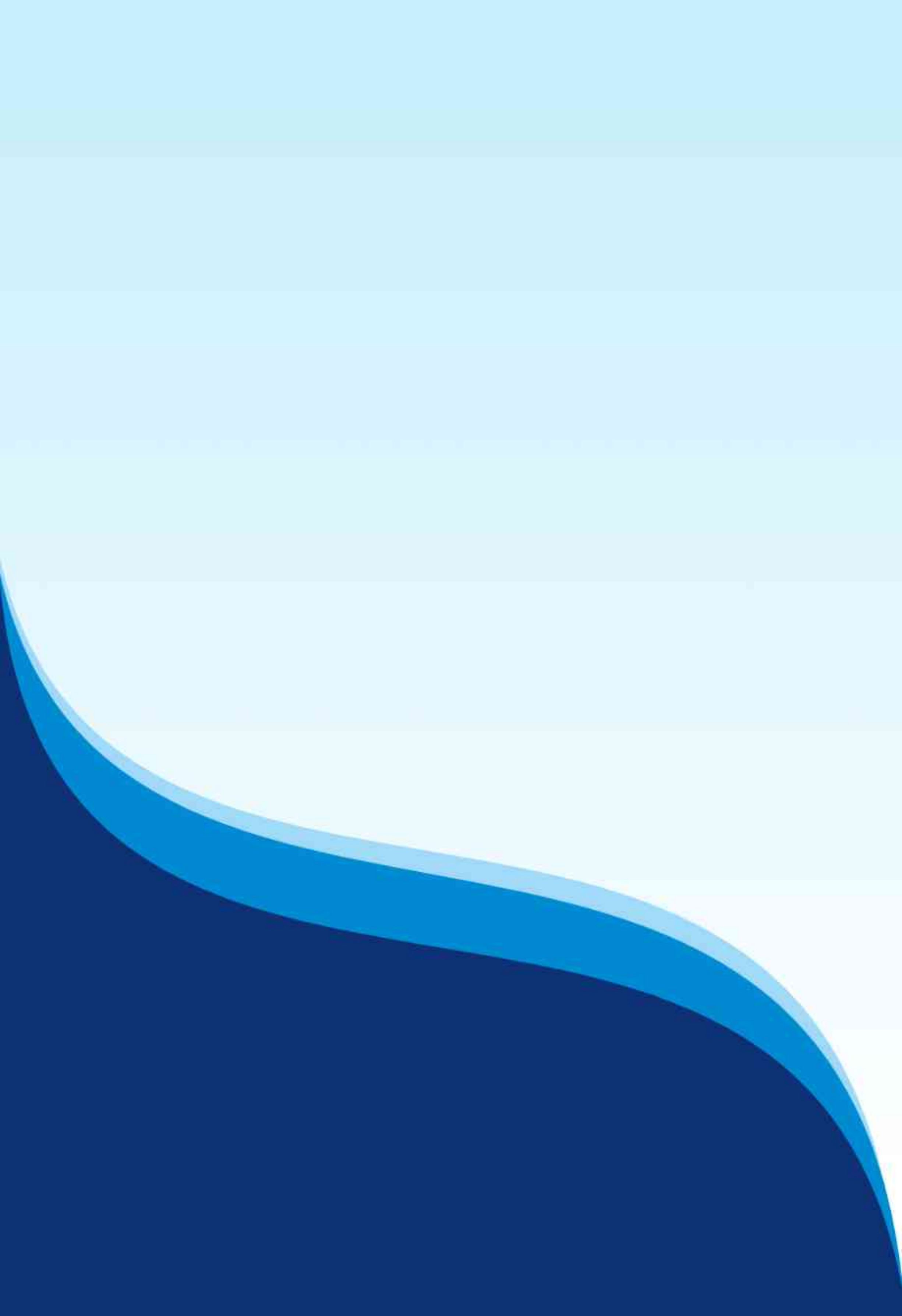

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सं. एफ. 9-42/2005-यू. 3 (ए)--- जबकि विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा 3 के अंतर्गत केन्द्र सरकार को विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग की सलाह पर किसी उच्चतर अध्ययन संस्थान को "समावेशविद्यालय" घोषित करने का अधिकार प्राप्त है।

2. और जबकि नेहरू ग्राम भारती, कोटवा-जामुनीपुर, डबवाली जिला उत्तराखण्ड से प्रस्ताव प्राप्त हुआ है जिसमें विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा के अंतर्गत समविश्वविद्यालय की दर्जा की मांग की गई थी।

3. और जबकि, विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग ने उक्त प्रस्ताव को जांच कर है और दिनांक 12 जून, 2007 के अपने पत्र संख्या एफ. 6-54/2005 (सी.पी.ओ. 1) के माध्यम से नेहरू ग्राम भारती को शुरुआत के 3 वर्ष के लिए विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा 3 के अंतर्गत 'समावेशविद्यालय' का दर्जा प्रदान करने की सिफारिश की है।

4. अतः विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा 3 द्वारा दी गई शक्तियों का उपयोग करते हुए केन्द्र सरकार विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग की सलाह पर राजीव गांधी स्नातकोत्तर कालेज सड़ित नेहरू ग्राम भारती को उक्त अधिनियम के प्रयोजनार्थ 3 वर्ष की अवधि के लिए समावेशविद्यालय के रूप में घोषित करती है जो कि उस तिथि से प्रभावहीन होगा जिस तिथि से उक्त कालेज स्वयं को अपने सम्बद्ध विश्वविद्यालय अर्थात् सड़ित सद्गो महाराज विश्वविद्यालय, कानपुर से असंबद्ध कर लेगा। नेहरू ग्राम भारती को दिया गया दर्जा इस शर्त के अधीन होगा कि 3 वर्ष की अवधि समाप्त होने से पहले विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग विशेषज्ञ समिति की सहायता से इस दर्जा की समीक्षा करेगा। इस दर्जा को पुष्टि तथा होगी जब विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग की विशेषज्ञ समिति की जांच और मूल्यांकन रिपोर्ट पर विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अपनी सिफारिशें दे देगा।

5. उपर्युक्त पैरा 4 में की गई उद्धोषणा इस शर्त के भी अधीन है जिसका अन्तर्गत इस अधिसूचना के पृष्ठान्त की क्रम संख्या 3 पर किया गया है।

6. न तो भारत सरकार और न ही विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग नेहरू ग्राम भारती या इसकी अंगीभूत शिक्षण इकाई को योजनागत और योजनाएत सहायता अनुदान प्रदान करेंगे।

And whereas, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, the Central Government, on the advice of UGC, had declared the following Institutions as Institutions deemed to be Universities for a certain period, as under :—

3. And whereas, the functioning of these Institutions were reviewed by the UGC with the help of its Expert Committee in accordance with UGC (Institutions deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023 (the "IDTBU Regulations, 2023" hereafter) regarding extension of the status of the institution as deemed to be university under clause 6 of the said regulations.

4. And whereas, the Expert Committee recommended for extension of their deemed to be University status.

5. And whereas, the report of the UGC Expert Committee was considered and approved by the Commission in its 574th meeting held on 3rd November 2023.

6. Now, therefore, on the advice of UGC, the Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, hereby extends the deemed to be University status of the above Institutions with effect from the date of expiry of status provided in column (4) of Table at paragraph 2.

7. All the institutions shall follow the rules and regulations regarding fee structure, number of seats, etc. issued by the relevant statutory bodies with immediate effect. All the institutions should conform to the standards set in the IDTBU Regulations, 2023 within the time limit prescribed in the said regulations. All the other conditions mentioned in the earlier Notification(s) of this Ministry as well as the rules / regulations of UGC and other Statutory Councils, issued from time to time, shall continue to be adhered to by these Institutions.

Subject:- Deemed to be University status to Nehru Gram Bharati Viswavidyalaya.

Sir,

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, on the advice of University Grants Commission has declared Nehru Gram Bharati Viswavidyalaya comprising of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. college as deemed to be university in the name and style of 'Nehru Gram Bharati Viswavidyalaya' under Section 3 of UGC Act, 1956. The declaration is subject to further conditions mentioned below:-

- i) The management of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College shall legally vest with Nehru Gram Bharati the Society created to manage the affairs of the deemed-to-be-university institution.
- ii) All the moveable and immovable assets of Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College, should be transferred and vested with the Nehru Gram Bharati formed to manage the 'deemed-to-be-university' institution, and registered as such in the interest of future of students, members of faculty, employees and for maintaining the standards of higher education. A report on compliance in this regard shall be submitted to the UGC and this Ministry at the earliest.
- iii) Nehru Gram Bharati and the society that will be managing it, should not undertake or engage in any activities that are of commercial and profit making in nature.
 - a. The corpus fund created by the Nehru Gram Bharati Society should be irrevocable in nature and should not be liquidated without the prior consent of the UGC. Accordingly, Nehru Gram Bharati shall submit an undertaking in this respect to the UGC immediately and also take necessary action in consultation with the UGC to ensure irrevocability of the corpus fund.
 - b. The academic programmes being offered or to be offered by Nehru Gram Bharati will conform to the norms and standards prescribed by the relevant Statutory Councils such as the UGC, AICTE, etc. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not offer/award, as the case may be, any degrees that are not specified by the UGC. Nehru Gram Bharati shall also ensure that the nomenclatures of the degrees, etc. to be awarded but it are specified by the UGC under Section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956.

- c. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start new academic courses without obtaining prior approval of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and/or the concerned Statutory Councils such as MCI, AICTE etc., as the case may be.
- d. Nehru Gram Bharati, as a deemed to be university, shall award degrees in respect of the courses run by the institution mentioned in para 4 of this notification only to those students who are admitted subsequent to the date of this notification. Accordingly, it shall make admission and enrolment of students to the academic courses of the said college under it (i.e. under Nehru Gram Bharati only with effect from the ensuing academic year (i.e. from 2008-09).
- e. As for the students who were already admitted to Rajiv Gandhi P.G. College prior to the date of this notification, they shall continue to pursue their courses of study under affiliation to the present affiliating university, namely, Ch. Shahuji Maharaj University, Kanpur which shall conduct examinations for them and award degrees to them upon successful completion of the courses/programmes of study they are pursuing at the college presently.
- f. All the prescribed norms and procedures of the relevant Statutory Councils, such as UGC, MCI AICTE etc. and other authorities concerned in the matter of admission of students, intake capacity of students, starting of new courses/programmes, renewal of approval to the courses, etc. will continue to be in force, and shall be adhered to by the Nehru Gram Bharati.
- g. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not conduct any distance education programmes without prior approval of UGC and Distance Education Council (DEC). The guidelines issued by both the DEC and the UGC from time to time in the matter of imparting education through distance mode have to be complied with by it.
- h. Nehru Gram Bharati shall not start and run any study centre / off-campus centre / off-shore campus without obtaining the requisite prior approval of the UGC/Government of India, as the case may be.
- i. As and when necessary, the Nehru Gram Bharati Society shall suitably amend and update its MOA/Rules in consultation and in concurrence with the UGC. Specific changes/amendments, if any, suggested by the Government of India or UGC shall also be carried out by the deemed-to-be university institution in its MOA/Rules with the approval of the UGC.
- j. Nehru Gram Bharati shall strictly abide by all the norms and guidelines as laid down by the UGC and other Statutory Councils such as Medical Council of India, AICTE etc. from time to time, as are applicable to institutions notified as 'Deemed-to-be-Universities'.
- k. Suggestions, if any, made by the UGC's Expert Visiting Committees during its visit at the institute or in its inspection report submitted to the UGC, should be followed by Nehru Gram Bharati so as to rectify deficiencies, if any, to bring about the recommended improvement.

Journey of Nehru Gram Bharati

(Deemed to be University)

Preamble

NEHRU GRAM BHARATI (Deemed to be University) came into existence as the first rural University of U.P. State and probably one of few in rural area based Institutes of higher learning in India. It enjoys recognition as a deemed to be university, granted by the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development u/s 3 of U.G.C. Act-1956, vide Notification No. F.9-42/2005-43(A), dated 27 June, 2008.

It was basically conceived by the 1st Prime Minister of India, Late Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, who laid the foundation stone of Nehru Gram Bharati on 26 July, 1962 in the village of Rishi Durvasa Ashram Kotwa-Jamunipur-Dubawal complex of his Phulpur Parliamentary constituency in Allahabad district. His dream was translated into reality by Sri J. N. Misra, who has vision and dedication to the cause of upliftment of rural masses through education.

As on date, the campus has establishment of professional and technical education, besides traditional education for meeting the aspirations of youth from rural as well as urban areas. To begin with Rajiv Gandhi P. G. College was established in the year 1996 and subsequently merged in the NGB (Deemed to be University) in 2008-2009.

Today, NGB (Deemed to be University), is spread across 72 acres of land, with 5 campuses namely; 1. Hanumanganj comprising , Faculty of Law, 2. Jamunipur comprising Major Academic unite Courses, 3. Jhoothi Tali comprising Research Centre and Central Library, University Admin 4. City comprising Diploma in Photography and other Professional Courses, 5. Sarpatipur designated for Medical College.

Ranging prography NGB has close to 300 teaching and administrative staff with 26 departments ranging from traditional subjects to professional courses and special education courses to develop trained manpower for teaching children with disabilities. Apart from providing unique opportunities for education to youths from rural background, the NGB endeavors to offer training and teaching to disadvantaged section of society including girl child, women, SC and ST along with special emphasis given to improve quality of teaching through innovative methods.

We aim to nurture and promote youth especially from rural area by providing high quality education and training in keeping with the promise of Late Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru. Our dream is to build a role model Institution with state of art infrastructure providing right ambience for creativity and stimulation in thinking to generate new ideas for research and application of skill for developing technology for welfare of mankind.

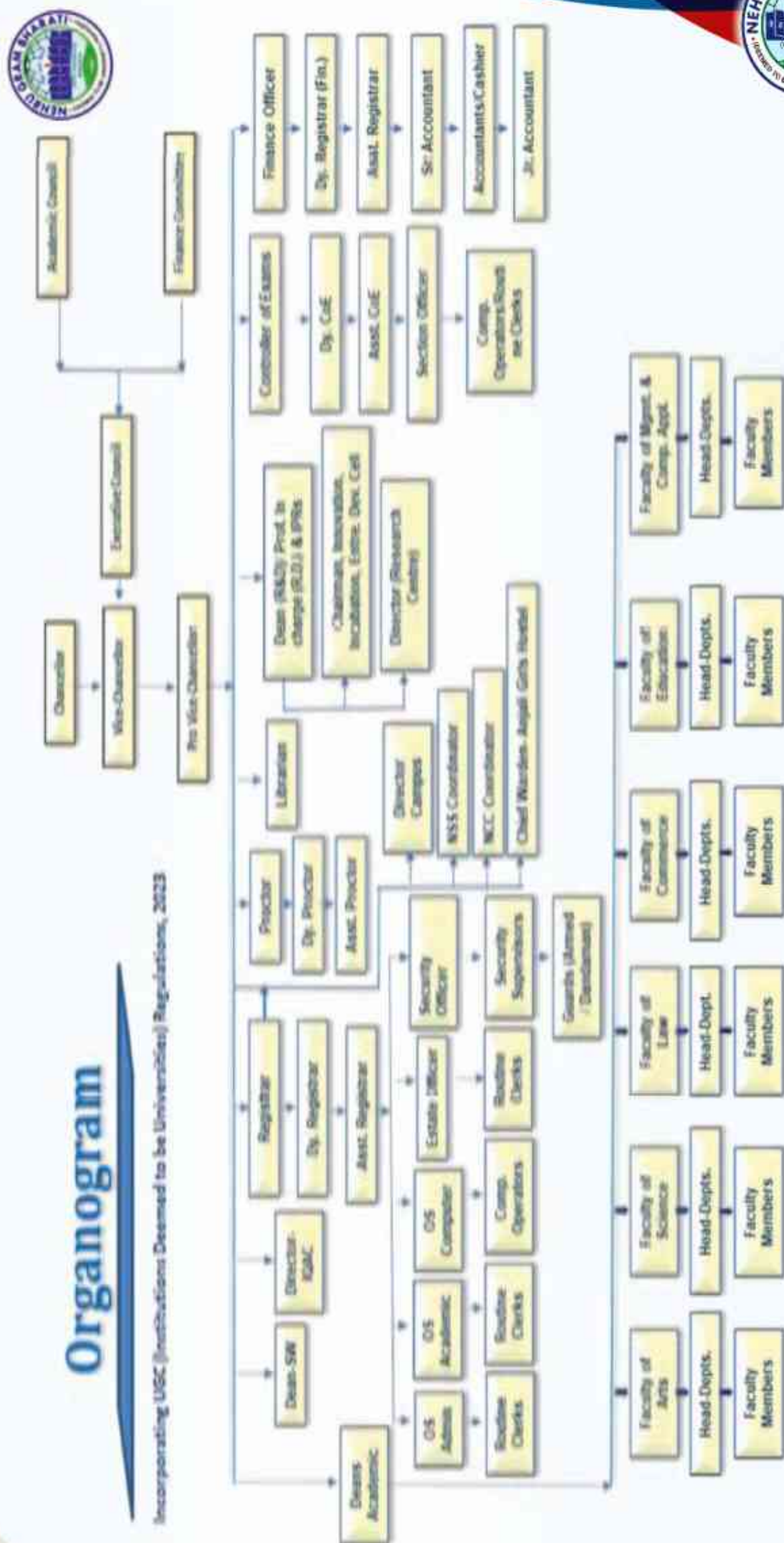

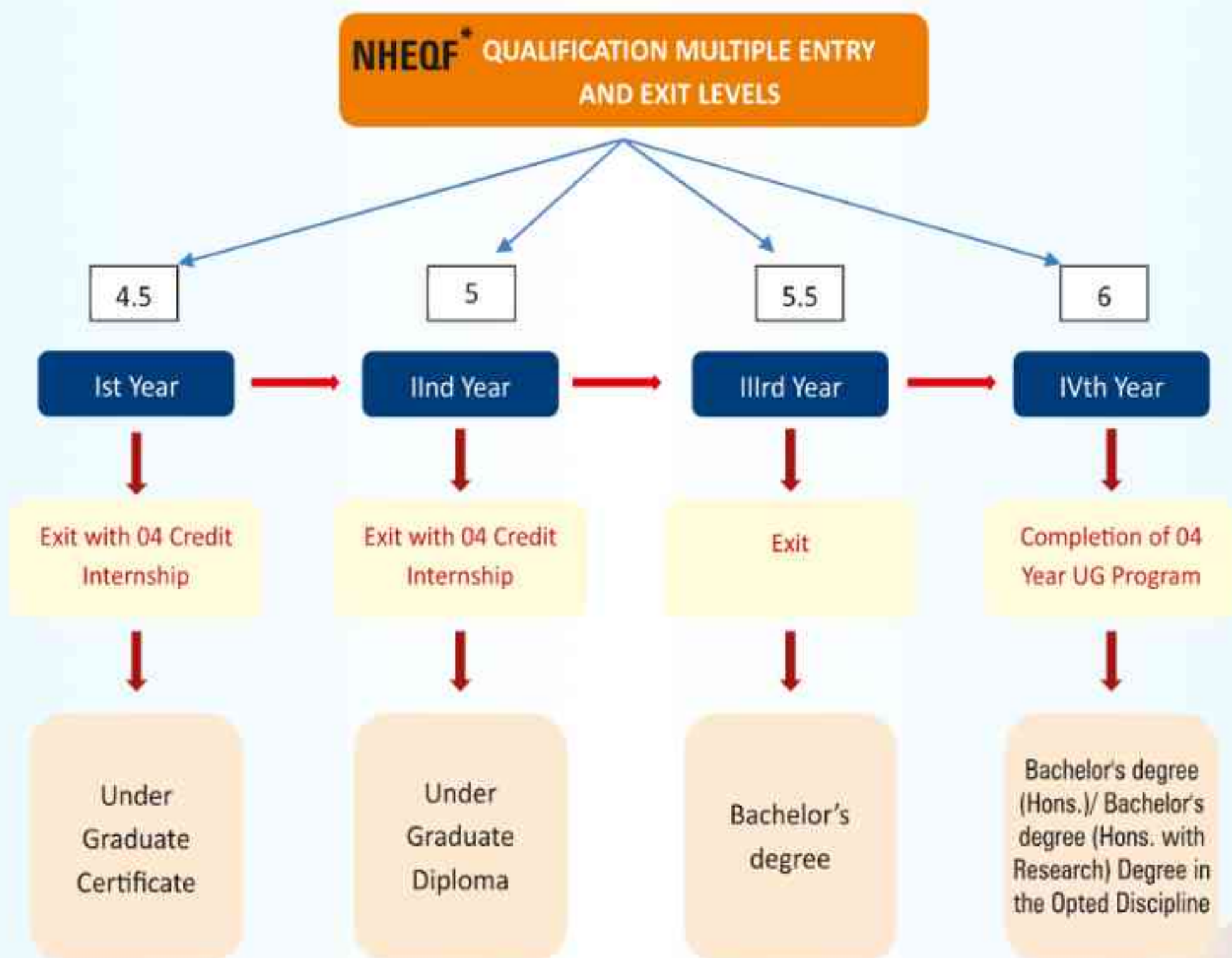

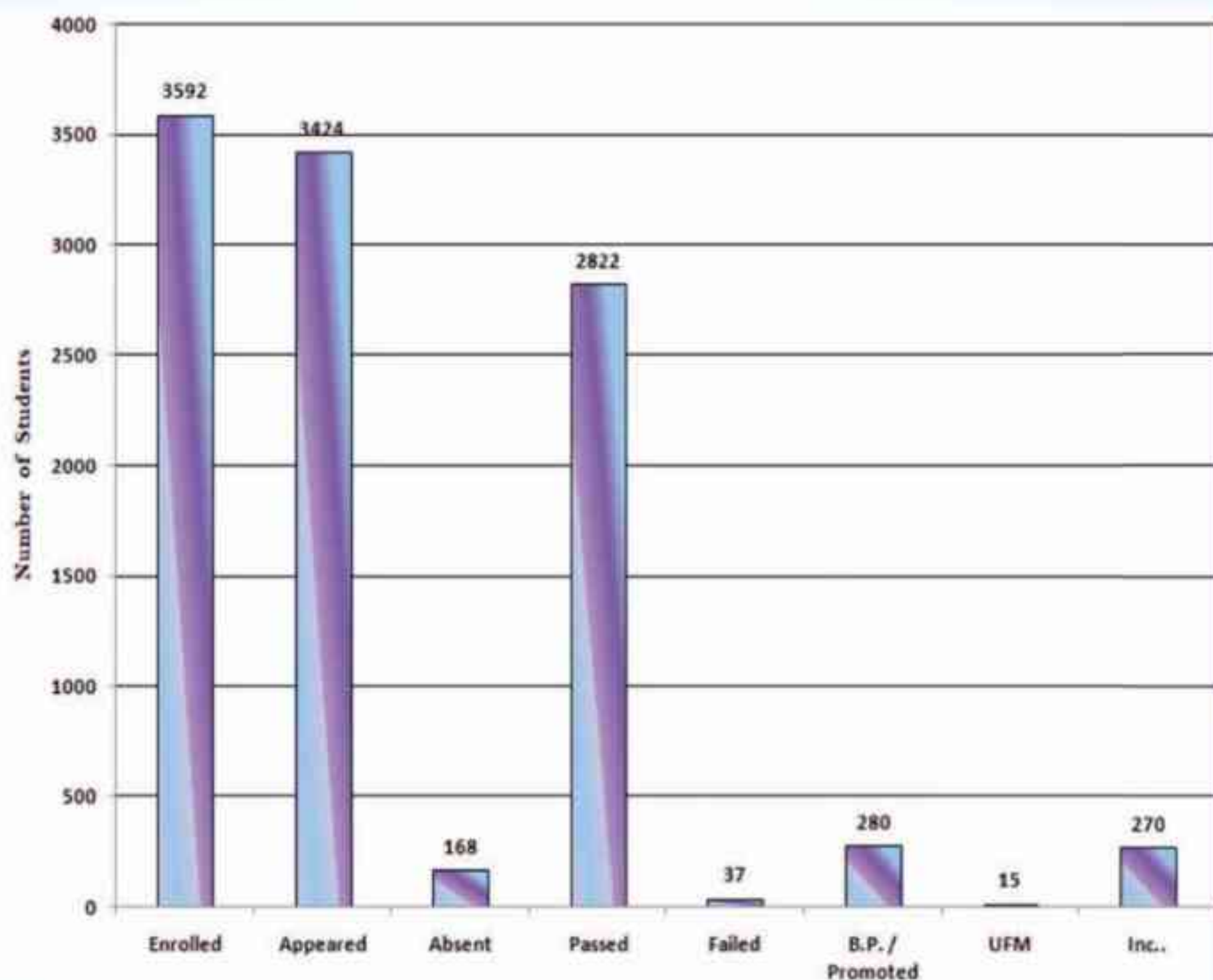

Rover/Ranger

Introduction: Rover/Ranger is the senior branch of Scouting. It was started by Lord Baden Powell, the founder of the Scout movement. Any regular student of the University/college between the age of 15 to 25 years can be enlisted as Rover (Male Student)/ Ranger (Female Student). A unit of 24 rovers is called a rover crew and a unit of 24 rangers is called a ranger team. Rowing/ranging is a uniformed activity.

Objectives:

- Rover / Ranger aims at 'Social Service'. Rover / Ranger renders services



individually and in an organized manner with the spirit of selflessness, sacrifice and dedication to solve various types of problems of the society.

- Interested students of the university will participate in the training camps of Rover / Ranger and after that they will make their character bright by doing social service.
- Rover / Ranger also plays a special role as a volunteer in maintaining order, service and discipline by attending all the functions organized in the university.
- Through this program the students are transformed from the limited circle of 'I' into the extension of 'We'.

Membership: In Nehru Gram Bharati (Deemed to be University), two units of Rover/Ranger have been formed at the university level in which 48 students and 48 girls can register and participate in the course. No fee will be charged from the students for the program. All interested students can apply for this course except the students registered in NCC and NSS.

Scheme for Advancement of Rovers/Rangers:

Admission : Rovers/Rangers will have to work for 3 months prior to receiving Entry, Rovers/Rangers initiation.

Nipun Badge: Entry Rovers / Rangers will have to work for at least 6 months to get Nipun Badge and Certificate.

State Award Badge: An accomplished Rovers/Rangers will have to work for at least 9 months to get the State Level Certificate and Badge which is called State Awarded Rovers/Rangers.

President Award Badge: A state award Rovers / Rangers will have to work for at least 1 year to get the national level certificate and badge called 'President Rovers / Rangers'.

After obtaining the President's Certificate, the Rovers/Rangers can serve on various Efficiency Medals as a regular student till the age of 25 years.

In compliance with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor dated 09 September 2021, 4 teams of Rovers/Rangers have been formed in the university, in which 2 teams are for students and 2 teams are for girls. Up to 24 students can participate in each team.

After obtaining the President's Certificate, the Rovers/Rangers can serve on various Efficiency Medals as a regular student till the age of 25 years.

National Service Scheme

Introduction & History:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government sector public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community (esp. Villages) linkage.

After independence the University Grants Commission, headed by S. Radhakrishnan, recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January, 1950; after examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In the draft first Five-Year Plan adopted by the government in 1952, the need for social and labour service by Indian students for one year was stressed. In 1958 Jawaharlal Nehru, in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. He directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions.


